When to go:

There's no bad time to go, but peak season is June through October, when Migration river crossings are most likely. Tanzania's 'green season', between November and March, is much quieter, wet, but can witness new babies being born. Rains are heaviest in April and May.


About the area:

The Masai Mara National Reserve is perhaps one of the most well-known safari destinations in the world. Home to the Great Migration, the Mara and Talek Rivers, and the Maasai culture. Also a spectacular place for a balloon safari. Known for big cats and the rest of the Big 5.



















TOPACCOMMODATIONS ARUSHA REGION



About the area:

Laikipia, formerly made up of ranch lands, is becoming well-known as an equal to the Maasai Mara in terms of safari experience. It is home to about half of Kenya's roughly 600 black rhinos, and the numbers of wild dogs here are on the rise. Grevy's zebras are a common sight, as are more common wildlife like elephants.


About the area:

About the area:

Traditional homeland of the Samburu people with relatively few safari camps and lodges. The elephant is dominant here, but the area is also known for sightings of the Grevy's zebra, gerenuk antelope, Beisa oryx, and reticulated giraffe, plus all three big cats.

About the area:


Tsavo East is the largest of Kenya's parks, yet is home to very few camps and lodges. It is well-known for its herds of elephants. Tsavo West is home to dramatic lava flows, Mzima Springs, and abundant wildlife, but very few visitors.

Both of these parks are remote, and accommodations are limited.
