



## Geography:

Morocco lies at the crossroads of Africa and Europe, just across the Strait of Gibraltar from Spain. Its landscapes are remarkably diverse: deserts, mountain ranges, valleys, and over 1,200 miles coastline.

This variety allows travelers to experience multiple worlds in a single journey.


## Climate:

Spring (March to May) and Fall (September to November) are the most comfortable seasons to travel with warm sunny days and cool nights. Moroccan winters are very mild during the day, but cold at night. Summer is hot, especially in the desert, but ocean breezes and higher altitudes make it pleasant.






## ADVENTURE

# MARRAKECH

Marrakech pulses with an intoxicating energy where ancient tradition meets contemporary luxury. The red medina hums with life. Snake charmers in Jemaa el-Fnaa, labyrinthine souks scented with leather and spice, and secret garden riads offering tranquil refuge behind unassuming doors.



Marrakech's riads and resorts redefine Moroccan hospitality. Stay in a meticulously restored 18th-century palace with a private plunge pool, dine at La Mamounia's gardens, or book a spa day at the Royal Mansour where each guest enjoys their own three-story riad within the property.



# FES

Fes is Morocco's spiritual, cultural, and culinary capital. Its UNESCO-listed medina, the world's largest car-free urban zone, remains virtually unchanged since the Middle Ages.



Fes remains the guardian of Morocco's ancient crafts.

Commission custom tiles, watch master weavers create silk kaftans on centuries-old looms, and visit the Chouara Tannery where leather has been dyed using medieval techniques for over 1,000 years



Just outside of Fes, explore the Roman Ruins of Volubilis, the Imperial Capital of Meknes and traditional Berber cave homes.

# TANGIER & CHEFCHAOUEN

Northern Morocco seduces with a distinct personality shaped by Mediterranean breezes and multicultural heritage. Tangier, once the playground of bohemian writers and international spies, retains its former glamor with views over the Strait of Gibraltar, grand hotels and a renovated medina.



Chefchaouen captivates as a photogenic jewel—a mountain town washed entirely in shades of blue. Where every corner feels like you've stepped into a painting. After wandering the medina, retreat to your boutique riad terrace with endless mountain views



# CASABLANCA & RABAT

Meet Morocco's cosmopolitan heart, where French colonial influence led to a blend of Moorish and European art-deco architecture. Spend your day shopping and eating along the promenade and visiting the magnificent Hassan II Mosque.



In contrast, the capital city of Rabat offers refined sophistication. Imagine UNESCO-listed medinas alongside diplomatic quarters, royal palaces with manicured gardens, and a relaxed café culture. Together, these cities reveal Morocco's contemporary face while honoring its storied past.



# OUARZAZATE

Where the Atlas Mountains surrender to the desert. Ouarzazate reigns as Morocco's cinematic capital, and has acted as ancient Egypt to alien planets. Visit the studios where your favorite movies and TV shows were filmed then retreat to your luxury Kasbah with endless desert on the horizon.



Beyond the film sets lie authentic treasures: the magnificent UNESCO-listed Aït Benhaddou kasbah rising from the earth like a sand castle, the dramatic Todra Gorge's towering cliffs, and the Valley of Roses blooming improbably in desert terrain.



# SAHARA DESERT

Morocco's ultimate adventure awaits where civilization dissolves into endless desert. This is the Morocco of dreams: camel caravans silhouetted against crimson sunsets, nights under impossibly star-filled skies, and the profound silence of the dunes.



Experience the Sahara from luxury camps that rival five-star hotels. Think Persian carpets on sand, sleeping under a sky of bright stars, champagne sunsets atop dunes, private tents with hot showers, and chefs preparing tagines in nomadic tradition.



# AGADIR & ESSAOUIRA

Morocco's Atlantic coast offers a refreshing contrast to the inland cities. Laid-back beach towns where ocean breezes cool the African sun and fresh seafood lines the streets. Essaouira enchants with its whitewashed medina, vibrant blue boats bobbing in the harbor, and a bohemian arts scene thriving within the city walls.



South, in Agadir, world-class spas specialize in argan oil treatments, golf courses stretch along the coast, and beachfront restaurants serve the freshest seafood with sunset views. It's Morocco's answer to Mediterranean beach luxury, with added exotic flair.




# ATLAS MOUNTAINS

Rising dramatically from desert plains, the Atlas Mountains reveal a Morocco few expect. Visit snow-capped peaks, terraced valleys dotted with Berber villages, and alpine landscapes that shift with the seasons. The High Atlas reaches over 4,000 meters at Mount Toubkal, North Africa's highest peak, while valleys below cascade with waterfalls and ancient kasbahs cling to hillsides.



Trek through walnut groves and apricot orchards, visiting traditional Berber villages and their famous hospitality. Luxury hotels like Kasbah Tamadot offer mountain retreats with heated pools, spa treatments, and terraces where you can watch the sun paint the peaks gold while sipping mint tea.

# FOOD & DRINK

## Moroccan Mint Tea

No Moroccan experience is complete without mint tea. Sweet, fragrant, and poured theatrically from a height, it is offered throughout the day as a symbol of welcome and friendship.

## Tagine

Named after its distinctive conical clay pot, tagine transforms ingredients into magic through slow braising with aromatics. Different culinary regions of Morocco have different iconic tagine fillings.





## Couscous

Friday's sacred dish features hand-rolled semolina grains steamed to fluffy perfection, crowned with tender vegetables, chickpeas, and succulent lamb in fragrant broth.

## Pastilla

This sweet and savory dish layers flaky pastry with chicken, almonds, and cinnamon or spiced pigeon, and then dusted with powdered sugar for a uniquely Moroccan meal.



## Fresh Seafood

Morocco's extensive Atlantic and Mediterranean coastline delivers exceptional fresh seafood to your plate. Find signature fresh dishes in harbor and fishing towns across the country!

## Morocco



**Languages:** The official languages are Arabic, Berber and French, but most know English, especially in the tourism sector.

**Currency:** The Moroccan Dirham (MAD) is the official currency. Cash is king in Morocco, and ATMs are widely available.

**Transportation:** To travel the country, there are options for private road transfers or domestic flights.

**Visas:** United States citizens may enter Morocco visa-free for up to 90 days.

**Packing:** Lightweight layerable clothing is essential for the warm days and cooler evenings. Women may want to dress modestly so lightweight longer layers and perhaps a shawl or pashmina.
